




A Message from the CEO
















2024 Achievements



ICNA Relief Launches Mobile Shower Project in San Diego

ICNA Relief, in partnership with the County of San Diego, proudly launched a Mobile Shower project. It was inaugurated by Sh. Omar Suleiman, CEO Abdul Rauf Khan, and the California team. This project provides unhoused access to showers, offering dignity and respect, and marks the start of many future impactful projects.

ICNA Relief and USDA Partner to Introduce Halal -Certified Food in TEFAP

ICNA Relief has collaborated with the USDA to provide halal-certified food options through the Emergency Food Assistance Program (TEFAP), label products, educate suppliers on halal certification, and achieve USDA's first recognition of halal as a category. This program will provide culturally appropriate nutritional support to Muslim communities across the U.S., promoting inclusivity and contributing towards solving food insecurity. This partnership furthers ICNA Relief's mission to serve diverse communities with dignity and respect.

ICNA Relief Partners with Global Refuge to Empower Refugee Resettlement

ICNA Relief is honored to collaborate with Global Refuge (LIRS) as a Refugee Resettlement agency, approved by the U.S. Department of State, Bureau of Population, Refugees, and Migration. Together, we aim to facilitate the resettlement process at 16 sites across the US, provide assistance and offer hope to those in need.



Celebrating the Distribution of the 1 Millionth Backpack

ICNA Relief celebrates a major milestone in 2024, surpassing the distribution of its 1 Millionth backpack since the launch of the Back2School Program in 2008. The Back2School Program restores dignity, empowers education, and unites communities, providing children with essential tools to break the cycle of poverty.

Hunger Prevention

The Hunger Prevention Program has been a beacon of hope since 2005, combating food insecurity nationwide through Food Pantries, Mobile Food Pantries, Hot Meal Distributions, Ramadan Food Boxes, the Daily Iftar Program during Ramadan, and Udhiya/Qurbani Meat Distribution. The program serves vulnerable groups, including single mothers, refugee families, and the homeless, operating across 48 food pantries and 100+ mobile locations from New York to California. It also acts as a catalyst for other vital relief programs such as Refugee Facilitation, Health Services, the In-Kind Donation Program, and Education & Literacy Programs.

Since the COVID-19 pandemic, the program has expanded its efforts in collaboration with the USDA, Congress, and food banks to introduce halal options through The Emergency Food Assistance Program (TEFAP). Furthermore, the Hunger Prevention Program has empowered around 850,000+ individuals nationwide to overcome food insecurity.

Committed to the vision of a hunger-free and healthy nation, ICNA Relief remains dedicated to providing "Food for Today and Hope for Tomorrow." Guided by the principles of "Muslims for Humanity," ICNA Relief welcomes individuals of all backgrounds seeking help through its Hunger Prevention Program.

I remember having to take two buses, one train and walk two miles with my little children to receive food from Dallas food pantry.







Health Services

In 2024, ICNA Relief Health Services proudly earned the Gold Seal from the NAFC for the clinics in South Carolina, Atlanta, and Dallas, a testament to our unwavering commitment to delivering quality healthcare. The Atlanta clinic introduced OB/GYN and women's health services through grants and hospital partnerships, expanding access for underserved women. The Dallas Clinic launched new services including free in-house X-rays, ultrasounds, physical therapy, chiropractic, and eye services. A Mock Residency Program Interview Training was also held, helping eight international medical graduates (IMGs) secure residencies. Dallas' community impact earned a state resolution from Representative Ana-Maria Ramos and the Carter Blood Care Award for saving 1,287 lives through 15 blood drives.

In South Carolina, we introduced an in-house LEEP procedure to improve gynecological care access and weekly vision services with a volunteer optometrist. A partnership with Roper Saint Francis Hospital has enabled no-cost care for high-risk pregnancies, providing critical support to mothers, ensuring healthier outcomes for mothers and babies in our community. Our South Carolina free clinic proudly serves as an academic training center for graduating students from medical school, physician assistant programs, nurse practitioner programs, and residents from local universities. These students receive invaluable handson training, which enhances their skills, broadens their perspective on underserved care, and kindles a deep sense of altruism. Over the past year, the clinic has provided over 10,000 hours of education to nearly 90 students, fostering a commitment to compassionate and equitable healthcare.

South Carolina's achievements were recognized with an SC House Resolution, Jefferson and Martin Luther King Award. Additionally, a four-year federal grant supports our new diabetes awareness initiative, emphasizing outreach and collaboration to reduce diabetes in our communities. These achievements reflect our commitment to equitable, compassionate, community-centered healthcare.

Disaster Relief

Disaster Relief Services (DRS) exemplifies the vision of ICNA Relief by providing critical assistance in times of need to the most vulnerable. In 2024, disasters such as hurricanes, tornadoes, floods, and wildfires have struck with increasing intensity, affecting countless lives nationwide. The DRS team works tirelessly to promote preparedness and resilience by offering workshops that educate communities on disaster response and recovery strategies.

In addition to proactive education, the team actively engages in response operations and recovery initiatives by partnering with local agencies, state and federal bodies, including governmental and non-governmental organizations, to aid disaster survivors.

As an active member of NVOAD (National Voluntary Organizations Active in Disaster), ICNA Relief collaborates with emergency agencies and FEMA to provide a wide range of services, including food and water distribution, hot meals, debris removal, medical assistance, and chainsaw operations. Beyond immediate relief, DRS focuses on educating communities, fostering relationships, and building resilience to create a stronger, more unified future.








Muslim Family Services

Muslim Family Services (MFS) made significant progress in 2024 in providing vital services to individuals and families in need. The program expanded its outreach efforts, touching thousands of lives through foster care education and advocacy, free mental health services, and financial assistance. With 2,997 counseling hours delivered to 3,178 clients, 109 workshops conducted, and services offered across 11 clinical sites, MFS played a key role in fostering healthier, stronger communities and addressing critical mental health and social needs.

MFS has successfully promoted many impactful initiatives, such as workshops for the elderly, drug addiction recovery programs, financial literacy coaching, and youth development activities that offer holistic support to beneficiaries. At the federal level, MFS represented its work in meetings with the Department of Health and Human Services, advocating for drug addiction education.

In addition, free mental health booklets were distributed to families, organizations, and Islamic centers to raise awareness. First Aid Mental Health Training certifications were also provided to many community leaders across different states while strengthening partnerships that expanded education in mental health and foster care.

Foster Care Advocacy & Training (F.A.T.E.)

In 2024, FATE remained a leading driver of change in the lives of children and their families, serving 85 families and offering stability and care to 352 children across nine states. Established in 2017, FATE operates nationwide with the primary goal of reviving the Sunnah of Kafalah by raising awareness about foster care and addressing the urgent need for Muslim foster homes. The program has established a network of support that connects vulnerable children—including unaccompanied refugee minors-with caring Muslim families, mentors, and advocates through community outreach, case management, and tailored programs.

FATE also provides support to families navigating through the foster care system by offering resources and culturally competent guidance from an Islamic values-based perspective, strongly emphasizing family reunification. Through partnerships with Child Protective Services, CASA, foster care agencies, and faith-based organizations, FATE ensures positive outcomes for children and families.

In 2024, FATE signed an MOU with Texas CASA, which oversees 74 programs nationwide. The program also hosted a CASA training session at the ICNA Relief Resource Center, facilitated by Dallas CASA. As a result, 11 individuals from the DFW Muslim community were sworn in as CASA volunteers to advocate for children in the foster care system.

Refugee Services

ICNA Relief's Refugee Program is committed to empowering individuals who have been affected by adversity and disaster. In 2024, it offered services such as housing, job training, and financial literacy, fostering self-sufficiency and integration into host communities. Refugees often face language barriers, unfamiliar job markets, and the trauma of displacement. To address these challenges, the Refugee Services Program provided refugees access to critical tools and resources that would help them rebuild their lives and contribute to society.

Throughout the year, the program emphasized education with vocational training, recognizing that many refugees bring skills that may not be recognized in their new environment. Moreover, English language classes and certification programs in fields like healthcare and technology were provided, enabling refugees to gain local credentials and improve communication skills. These initiatives align refugees' prior expertise with the demands of the local job market while addressing their emotional needs. The program's efforts helped refugees achieve stability, dignity, and fulfilling careers in their new homes.

The ICNA Relief Refugee Services Program has been approved by (PRM) The Department of State, Bureau of Populations, Refugees, and Migration as a Reception and Placement provider in 16 locations.

Transitional Housing

In 2024, the Transitional Housing program provided temporary housing and essential support services, empowering individuals to rebuild their lives. With a national network of 26 facilities in 16 states and 23 cities, the program served as a safe haven for women and children escaping homelessness or crises like abuse. Every client received the benefits of culturally competent, holistic care tailored to their specific needs, to empower them to create a supportive network.

Case managers assisted residents with finding employment, enrolling children in schools, securing health services, and developing a "Client Action Plan" focused on long-term goals. Moreover, residents received training in life skills, career counseling, and mentoring to achieve independence.

In addition, the program provided temporary housing to 232 women and 144 children, assisted 731 clients in finding affordable housing and offered over 18,402 hours of one-on-one support services. These services, valued at nearly \$3.1 million+, served as a lifeline for breaking the cycle of poverty and fostering self-sufficiency.





Back2School

Since 2008, the Back2School Program has positively impacted the lives of over one million students, achieving a historic milestone in 2024 with the distribution of 1,028,653 backpacks. This year, the program supported 43,000+ students across 35 states and 239 cities, with the total value of services provided reaching \$1,298,644.

More than just a school supply initiative, the program addresses critical needs for children while easing the financial burdens of families, 66% of whom earn less than \$20,000 annually. It fosters confidence, ensuring students enter classrooms ready to thrive.

In 2024, additional initiatives included the awarding of 11 scholarships, equipping 61 classrooms through EMPOWER Grants, and hosting workshops on parenting and mental health, which benefited over 23,000 viewers.

EMPOWER Grants (Educating Minds & Presenting Opportunities While Endowing Resources) provide educators with resources to nurture young leaders, preparing students for a future of limitless potential. The community rallied behind the program, with 1,043 volunteers dedicating over 4,000 service hours and 79 ambassadors championing the cause.
